

Mathematics: Number:- count, read, write, add, subtract and estimate, odd, even, number pairs, doubling and halving, partitioning into tens and ones, rounding to the nearest 10, repeated addition, multiplication and division. Place Value:- locating numbers on a number line, understanding $< = >$.

Statistics:- collecting, presenting and analysing data.

Geometry:- learning 2D and 3D shapes, describing their properties, sorting and building shapes, following and giving directions, clockwise and anti-clockwise turns. Measurement:- money – using the fewest coins, exchanging coins for equal amounts, giving change, read and write analogue and digital time, read temperature.
