The total PE and Sport Premium allocation for 2016-17 was £8265. £4821 was used towards the funding of the building of the new Multi Use Games Area (MUGA).

The impact of the MUGA is linked to Indicator 1 – 'The engagement of all pupils in regular physical activity – the Chief Medical Officer guidelines recommend that all children and young people aged 5 to 18 engage in at least of 60 minutes of physical activity a day, of which 30 minutes should be in school.'

All school children now have access to a far larger outdoor sports and games area for use during all but the worst weather. In addition, external providers, such as Premier Sports, can now teach in an external environment that contributes to higher quality outcomes for children throughout the school. Midday supervisors have the potential to plan and implement a more extensive range of activities that will contribute to achieving indicator 1. This in turn impacts on behaviour and attitude.
