Hello everyone

Welcome to the first newsletter of this academic year. I hope you all enjoyed some time with your families over the summer and have enjoyed the sunshine of the last week! It was so lovely to see lots of smiling faces last Monday and we have been thrilled with how brilliantly settled the children are in just a few short days. This newsletter doesn't contain a lot of news, but it does have lots of dates to get in your diaries. There may be very little detail at the moment, but it is useful if you could save the date at this stage and we will give more information when we have it.

Our older children are excitedly awaiting their residential trips in the next few weeks. Lion class are going to the Frontier Centre at Irthlingborough this Wednesday to Friday and a couple of weeks after that, Zebra class are going to the Grafham Centre for two nights. We aim to book residential visits every two years, so that all the children are offered one residential during their time in Year 3 and 4 and another one during either Year 5 or 6.

I need to tell you about an important Forest School change. From this week, ALL children in ALL classes will be having Forest School on a TUESDAY. The younger children YR to Y2 will have their session together on a Tuesday morning and the older two classes will have sessions as normal on a Tuesday afternoon. It will still be a PE ready day for the younger children in Monkey and Meerkat classes.

Those pupils who have violin or piano lessons with Mrs Edwards will now have their lessons on a MONDAY, not a Thursday.

Finally, I am sorry but I need to have an early moan about parking. We have been contacted by a local resident who is concerned that a number of parents have started regularly parking on the kerb across from the entrance to the Village Hall. Not only does this create a potential hazard to vehicles turning in from the BGGO, but it also means that families are not using the pedestrian crossing. Please could I also remind you that there must be no stopping on the yellow zig zags, even if only briefly. You may be aware that we have been spot visited by a traffic enforcement officer several times in the last year. Stopping on the yellow zig zags is a traffic offence and if this is seen, you will be issued with an instant ticket. It also makes it hazardous for families to leave and for us to safely load the children on the school bus. Thank you.
