Recently, we have been deciding on some key roles for our oldest children. Every Y6 child is on a rota for extra responsibility jobs. They work with a friend and each week change job. These include supporting younger children in the hall with cutting up their lunch, leading the whole school Achievement assembly each Friday, writing the Lion class blog for the website and going over to Pre-school on a Wednesday to read a story.

In addition to this, the whole staff group decides on a Head Boy and Head Girl each year (selecting from children who would like the role). This year, I am delighted to announce that our Head Girl is **Lois** and our Head Boy is **Connor**. We know they will carry out their roles brilliantly.
